#### Special Events and Food at School

Students at Caistor Central are reminded regularly that we do not share food. One of the reasons for this expectation is that we have a number of students that have significant, and in some cases, life threatening food allergies (not only to peanuts) and other significant dietary needs that may cause serious health complications.

Although strongly discouraged, if a parent/guardian is inquiring about bringing food items for the purpose of sharing (e.g. Halloween, birthdays, holidays, etc.), the following needs to take place:

- parent communication with homeroom teacher prior to bringing any food items for the purpose of sharing;
- food items would need to be individually wrapped and peanut/nut free;
- the individually wrapped food items will be provided to the students by a teacher prior to them leaving at the end of the school day (i.e. placed in backpacks), therefore, the decision can be made at home as to what to do with the item;
- individual 'Dollar Store' items (e.g. erasers, pencils) are preferred over food items due to safety (anaphylaxis) and nutrition;

If you do not wish your child to receive food items at school to take home, please also communicate directly to your child's teacher. Thank you so much for your continued understanding and support.





#### **Mental Illness Awareness Week 2023 #MIAW**

This year, <u>Mental Illness Awareness Week</u> is from October 1-7. Mental Illness Awareness Week is an annual national public education campaign designed to help open the eyes of Canadians to the reality of mental illness.

**Annual Memorial Forest Vigil:** The Memorial Forest seeks to reduce the stigma around mental illness and promote a greater understanding and compassion from the community as a whole. Each year, a Memorial Forest Vigil is held during Mental Illness Awareness Week to provide an opportunity to share stories of hope and success as told by individuals and family members living with mental illness.

**Mental Illness and Stigma:** Stigma is when someone views you in a negative way because you have a distinctive characteristic or personal trait that is thought to be a disadvantage (a negative stereotype). Stigma can occur from a lack of understanding of mental illness. This stigma can lead to discrimination, and it may be direct or unintentional.

Some of the harmful effects of stigma can include:

- Hesitancy to get help or treatment
- Lack of understanding by family, friends or others
- Fewer opportunities for work, school or social activities
- Bullying, physical violence or harassment
- The belief that you'll never succeed at certain challenges or that you can't improve your situation

You can help reduce stigma by educating yourself, being aware of your attitudes and behaviours and choosing your words carefully when you talk about mental illness and substance use disorders.
